Pastor Jodie's Jottings...

Dear Family in Faith,

As March begins, we are in the midst of Lent and so continuing to "Desperately Seek Jesus" through our scripture and sermons and in finding those Jesus figurines throughout the church. It does my heart good every time someone comes up to me and tells me, "I found Jesus." That is always our intent, day in and day out to find Jesus where we live, where we work, in scripture, in mission and outreach, and in fellowship. I can't actually remember any Easter sermons that I have heard over the years, but I have wonderful memories growing up of Easter egg hunts, Sunrise Services in the church cemetery, finding our Easter baskets carefully hidden by my parents and family gatherings for Easter dinner and, of course, the obligatory photographs of family members holding their Easter lilies!

As I look back, I think that services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday have been most meaningful and impactful, the darkness, the sadness, imagining what it would have been like for Jesus to be beaten almost nearly to death and then be nailed to a cross. I'm sure that you have some of those memories as well. As I've considered those memories and what they mean, I think that the most important part of Easter is not necessarily Easter itself, but what comes before and what comes after that give meaning to the empty tomb of Easter.

The cross of Christ marks a moment of transition in our lives from darkness into light; from despair into hope; and even from past into the future. What comes during the transition is sacrifice. The cross of Christ represents the ultimate act of sacrifice based upon the selfless, redeeming love of Christ. When I think about us, First United Methodist Church, as a community of faith, I give thanks for the countless hours offered sacrificially in mission and service in the name of Jesus. I feel that God is bearing fruit through these efforts. All of this fruit is born from the toil and sacrifice on the part of servants like yourself, following in the cross-bearing footsteps of Christ. I hope you might consider honoring the sacrifice of our Lord that leads to new life and resurrection by offering yourself in one or more of the following three ways as the Lord leads you: 1.) Sacrifice your pride and invite a friend or family member to church, even if they might say no. We will have a Maundy Thursday Seder Meal and Communion Service beginning at 6:00pm on March 28; our Good Friday service will begin at 7:00pm on March 29. Since Easter Sunday is a fifth Sunday and one of our Celebration Sundays (and we certainly have much to celebrate on Easter), we will gather for a Sunrise Worship service at 7:00am, followed by breakfast and worship at 9:30am. It's our prayer that whoever you invite will encounter Jesus through our worship.

2.) Consider a sacrificial gift to the church, above and beyond your regular tithes and offerings. You can use the attached envelope to make that gift or give online through our church website or via Venmo. The Easter offering will continue to fund our ministries and outreach activities.

3.) Most importantly, offer yourself "in prayer and thanksgiving as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God" (Romans 12:1).

Thank you so much for your support of the soul-saving and life-changing work of God through the missions and ministries of First United Methodist Church by your prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. As Easter people, let us continue to share Jesus by Loving God! Loving Others! Blessings, Prayers and Love,

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Love Cupboard Food Pantry

Once again we had a heavy turnout with good weather and compassionate helpers serving our neighbors and friends. Seventy-four returning households represented 160 persons made up of 28 children, 91 adults and 39 seniors over 60 years old. We also had 14 new households come for nourishment. These folks represented 34 persons made up of 10 children, 23 adults and 1 senior over 60. When you add up these numbers, we helped 194 people maintain reasonable nourishment, while also providing them with cleaning supplies and paper goods until our next distribution on March 20. Since July 1, 2023 we have signed up 200 families into our Love Cupboard program. I constantly repeat our gratitude: THANK YOU, THANK YOU for your continued food and financial support to keep our program advancing. Many hours a month are devoted. Yes, you can be part of this mission. Just call the church office and Darren can give you direction to volunteer or donate financial support.

Ten Questions to Ask Yourself as We Begin the Season of Lent

1. When I wake up on Easter Sunday morning, how will I be different?

2. Is there a habit or sin in my life that repeatedly gets in the way of loving God with my whole heart or loving my neighbor as myself? How do I address that habit over the next 40 days?

3. Is there anyone in my life from whom I need to ask forgiveness or pursue reconciliation?

4. What practical steps can I take to carve out time for daily devotions and prayer?

5. What spiritual discipline do I need to improve upon or want to try?

6. What are some things in my life that I tell myself I need but I don't?

7. Why am I giving up this particular thing? How does giving it up draw me closer to God and prepare me for Easter?

8. What am going to tell myself when self-denial gets hard?

9. Is it necessary/helpful for me to share the nature of my fast with others or should I keep it private?

10. What do the ashes mean to me this year?

Four Fasts to Consider 1. Choose to make water your only beverage for 40 days.

2. Give up eating out for 40 days and donate the money you save to the food pantry.

3. Do a 40-day purge of all your excess stuff and donate the best of it to Goodwill or a local thrift store that benefits your neighbors.

4. Unplug—TV, Facebook, Twitter, Netflix, etc. This is perhaps the single best way to carve out some extra time for prayer.

Karen G. Luderer Memorial Scholarship Fund

Karen Luderer lived her life as a devout Christian. Throughout her life, Karen epitomized the values of Christianity. She always looked past someone's indiscretions and valued the person. Karen spent years helping the less fortunate. Whether it was her prison ministry, 4th Avenue Adventure ministry, or any of the many committees in which she partook, she was always willing to listen, counsel and help. She never sought the spotlight. In fact, she went out of her way to avoid it. Helping others was her reward. In this light, the family of Karen Luderer established the Karen G. Luderer Memorial Scholarship Fund in 2018. **Criteria**

- A high school GPA of 2.50
- SAT score of 800 or an ACT score of 16
- A member of the United Methodist Church, an active member of the Youth Group of the United Methodist Church, or a former member of the Youth Group
- Traditional and non-traditional students are encouraged to apply

Selection Process

Interested people will give a short presentation (PowerPoint or other presentation form) to the Selection Committee. In the spirit of Karen, the Selection Committee wants to learn of the person beyond a résumé. The presentation should provide the committee with sufficient information to get to know the person. Topics may include, but are not limited to: any hardships/challenges in life, the role of religion in their life, specific experiences of volunteer work, specific experiences of Youth Group/work camps, and/or any life experiences that will provide insight into the person.

The scholarship will not just focus on grades and accomplishments, but the person as a whole. The presentation should be about 10 minutes and no more than 20 minutes. An interview will follow the presentation.

Award

Recipients will receive a \$1,000 scholarship that will be paid directly to the recipient's institution. The scholarship is renewable for a maximum of 4 years, as long as the student maintains a GPA of 2.50. Every year in May, students will be required to present a copy of their grades to the committee prior to disbursement.

Application

An application form can be picked up at the First United Methodist Church Office, 600 Wood Street, Clarion, PA 16214 or may be requested via email at churchoffice@fumc-clarion.org.

Deadline

All applications must be received by April 7, 2024. Selected applicants will be invited to provide the presentation/interview, occurring on a date to be determined—usually a Saturday in May. Interviews will be held in the Youth Room starting at 9:00am. The applicant will be notified by text or email. If for some reason an applicant is unavailable on this date, the committee will allow a Skype/Zoom presentation as long as the applicant meets all of the guidelines listed above.

The Franklin District Lay Servant Ministry Team is pleased to announce that registration is open for the **Spring Lay Servant School**. Classes will be held all four Sundays in April (7, 14, 21 & 28), 2:00-5:00pm. The classes being offered are The BASIC Class, Called to Preach, Conflict Resolution, and Spiritual Gifts. New Church Office Management and Hours

Beginning in January 2024 the church began a new office management process to support the changing needs of the church and to facilitate the transition to new staffing of the office with the consolidated position of Operations and Technical Administrator* to be filled by Darren Mackenzie. In advance, Pastor Jodie, Staff Parish Relations, and the Church Council want to ensure the congregation is aware of the changes that will be taking place.

The goal of the new office management process is to provide the congregation and community improved access to resources and care by increasing the use of communication technologies, which will also enable staff to complete project-based tasks that further our ministry. In order to meet this goal, a significant change will be a modification of church office hours as follows.

Important Change:

 <u>New hours for the church office beginning January 2024</u>: Monday - Thursday, 8:30am - 2:30pm; the office will be closed on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. Persons who have needs that require assistance outside of these hours are asked to contact the church office to make arrangements.
