Hello Church!

Ecclesiastes 3—To everything there is a season. Retirement is now fast approaching. I only have a few Sundays left to share with you as pastor. On May 28 I will be off and have invited Rev. Dr. Lt. Colonel Jonathan Bell to preach. Rev. Bell is appointed by our Bishop to serve beyond the local church. His appointment is as Chaplain to the Pennsylvania Air National Guard. During this time, he and his family have chosen to worship with us when he is not serving elsewhere. He has preached Christ here before and many of you were blessed to hear. We look forward to his sharing Christ with us again. My last Sunday in the pulpit will be June 4.

Ecclesiastes 3! To everything there is a season. Certainly so. We have just celebrated Jesus raised to life renewed on Easter. We are now moving through the days in which he made appearances through Judea and Galilee. We will soon celebrate Pentecost—the coming of the promised gift of the Holy Spirit, and then Ascension—Jesus ascending to Heaven. We await his second coming. We await, but not idly so, for we are his witnesses in the present day.

Witnesses in the present day . . . that is important to grasp. My preaching and teaching has been encouraging each of you to recognize the divine presence and encounters in these present days, in your very own lives. I am confident that the Lord God in Christ and Spirit touches each of you often in ways divinely designed for you to recognize, to open to, to be in dear relationship with. I am confident each of you already have a treasury of remembered instances. Share this treasury with family, friends, and your spiritual small groups. Share, and hear the stories of others.

A caveat, a warning—it is wise to recognize what underlays some of our challenges. Just as I recognize the divine, I also recognize there is evil that also abides in this world. Much of the anger directed at God would be better directed to its source—the enemy, the anti-Christ, the devil. The devil seeks to deceive, confuse, and to hurt. God is more powerful, and provides you all you need to beware, identify, defend, overcome. Both the divine and evil whisper to us, reach out to us. It is for us to choose which we follow. In Christ we are able to move from uncertainty to confidence, from hurt and anger to trust and acceptance of the divine, and the promise of life to come. Ask yourself when confronted with hurt or shame or even death, is this all there is to life? Is this the final outcome after all our life's effort? In Christ you have answers. Come to me all who are heavy laden and I will give you rest. Peace be with you. I am with you to the end of the age. Whosoever believeth in me, shall have the gift of everlasting life. So be it. Amen.



The finance committee is pleased to report that First Church is financially healthy with incomes slightly over budget and expenditures slightly under budget. There are needs that arise, often unexpected, that require attention. There are also needs to be addressed, having been put off for longer than they should. The replacement of the retaining wall for the Memory Garden, patio improvements at the parsonage, and garage replacement at the parsonage are three excellent examples. The Trustees and the Church Council have approved these projects for completion. Now it is our responsibility to see that these much needed fixes get paid for.

I am proud of our church and its congregation of caring and supportive laity. A few years back, there was a debate over whether we should abandon the present structure and build anew. I believe His Spirit led us in the right direction when we embarked on a major remodeling and building of the Connector which is today our Gathering Area. Much needed facilities were addressed including handicapped access, bathrooms on every floor, a library and conference space, offices and classroom improvements. What still amazes me is the dedication you have all shown to get this debt paid off. In addition to the refurbishment of our church facilities, we acquired property for future parking and other potential improvements.

Much like our own homes, there will always be things that need to be done. The Trustees are to be commended for their diligence in caring for our church needs. We on the Finance Committee ask you to continue your responsible stewardship for this cherished house of worship, which has meant so much to so many over the years.

THREE SUMMER PROJECTS

In worship we recently announced our THREE SUMMER PROJECTS campaign.

- 1. To replace the Memory Garden's rotting railroad tie retaining wall with an attractive long-lasting masonry wall and to refresh the plantings.
- **2.** To replace the broken, separating and lifting parsonage patio with a new concrete patio that slopes rainwater AWAY from the house's foundation.
- **3.** To replace the parsonage's old carriage house garage, which has been in recent danger of collapse, with a new one story parsonage garage.

The garden wall was the first task to complete and is already in. The garden team is preparing to do the refreshing. The total amount for the three projects is \$60,000—a bargain, because the labor of the garage is being done by church volunteers and mentors led by this year's summer mission youth work team. If you would like to donate to this campaign, please make your checks payable to First United Methodist Church and write Three Summer Projects on the memo line. Watch for our updates each Sunday in worship.

Methodist Foundation Update

First quarter results showed a significant turnaround in the market value of our investment of 19 different funds. We experienced a 4.8% increase in these funds at the foundation. This increase is added to quarterly earnings that come back to the church.

Over the timespan of this year, we will list the total 19 accounts. Here are the first five:

Love Cupboard Food Pantry

A special thank you to all of our dedicated volunteers who help stock, deliver, carry out and distribute the items each month for the Love Cupboard Food Pantry! In APRIL we were able to serve

68 households, which included 9 new families, for a total of 169 individuals. Those families were made up of 97 adults. 35 seniors, and 37 children.

Your church has had a significant increase in visitors calling and coming to our Love Cupboard Food Pantry over the last six months. April visitation was a record month for visitors and amount of food distributed. Several factors seem to be standing out that are influencing these large gains. Approximately six months ago we expanded distribution to include perishable items each month. They include milk, eggs, bread/rolls and frozen items including meat and cheese. The second factor is the elimination of the government run program called SNAP, which designated benefits to needy families. Needless to say, there is significant demand for nutritious food to help fill the gap that has been created by heavy inflation.

Our church and community have been very supportive financially and in person when we make our distribution on the third Wednesday of each month. We are always open to new volunteers to assist in the sharing of our blessings. We have also started handing out the *Upper Room* devotionals to all who would like one.

Mission Team Visits Homeless Shelters in Erie

People who are homeless in Erie have a place to go that will not turn them away. The Erie United Methodist Alliance (EUMA) believes that nobody should be without shelter.

On March 30, members of the Missions Team met with EUMA staff, who provided a citywide tour of their shelters intended for families, veterans, and youth in need of safe, secure and comfortable housing. Help extends to outreach, direct and referral services, and a pathway to permanent homes. Staff members are on call 24 hours a day, providing individual guidance and support

Our team saw renovated housing throughout the city equipped with modern security systems. We walked through freshly painted apartments that provide youth a place to transition from foster care to independent living.

Families with children, including single dads and their children, live at **The Refuge**. Some residents had been evicted from their homes. Others were escaping domestic violence. Private rooms keep families together, and each child gets a stuffed toy to cuddle and keep.

Across town, the **Liberty House** offers transitional shelter for male veterans, who receive help to battle addictions and other medical conditions. They have a case manager and choose from a range of social services to work their way back into the community.

EUMA volunteers host **Our Neighbors' Place**, Erie County's seasonal overflow shelter. When all other emergency shelter beds are full, people who come here for the night are assured a cot, blanket, chair, toiletries and a hot shower.

The EUMA is asking for our help to extend their outreach and expand their services to areas surrounding Erie. Clothes and household goods donated to the **Rainbow Connection Thrift Store** help neighbors and the people EUMA serves when they move from shelters into their own homes.
