Advent Greetings!

Advent is my favorite time of the year—decorating, shopping for gifts, Christmas carols . . . Those sacred hymns announcing the birth of Jesus that we sing only during this season of the year. My favorite carol is "Joy to the World"! One phrase in the first verse speaks to this time of Advent: "Let every heart prepare Him room"—that's what Advent is all about. A time of preparing our hearts and spirits for the arrival of Jesus into our lives once again.

Unfortunately, we sometimes get so caught up in the busyness of December that we forget the real reason for the season (as that often-heard cliché reminds us), "Jesus is the reason for the season." A cliché, but also a great truth; the foundational reason we celebrate Christmas is to commemorate the most poignant mark in history, when God became a human baby to enter this world with the purpose of freeing it from the curse of sin.

The little baby born in Bethlehem, Jesus the Christ, the Redeemer. And that is who we celebrate this season. We celebrate hope. We celebrate redemption. We celebrate that God doesn't abandon His people, no matter how much they disobey.

Yes, Jesus is the reason for the season . . . the Savior reigns, repeat the sounding joy! I look forward to worshipping and celebrating with you!

If you were not in the directory, and wish to be on our list, please let the church office know.

All of the organizations and churches that utilize these types of calling services are very pleased with their effectiveness. Current users have acknowledged how beneficial automated calling is with regard to being able to communicate with everyone.

We are excited to begin utilizing the One Call system for the church.



Hunger vs. FUMC Love Cupboard

November 15 has come and gone in a very big way at FUMC of Clarion. Seventeen new friends and neighbors with nutritional needs visited and registered in our Love Cupboard food pantry program.

That in itself is quite significant, but when you include the additional 80 households, we reached a high volume of guests. We were well prepared with goods for all. As we have done for the last 2 years, each household received a special allotment of items that helped them prepare for a Thanksgiving meal. Each of the volunteers was exhausted from the heavy afternoon of work.

The breakdown of visitors is as follows:

Total visitors - 97, Total household members - 230, Total children under 18 - 53, Adults up to 59 - 129, Seniors 60 and older - 45

Our program only exists out of the goodness of people's hearts and funds. Thank you to each supporter of this valuable community supported mission. We would welcome your participation on the third Wednesday of each month—please let the church office know of your volunteer interest.

2023 State of Mission Barn Report from Katie Peterson

Psalm 121:1-2 I lift up my eyes to the mountains—where does my help come from? My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth.

Grace and Peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Wow! Many things have changed since my last state of the Eastbrook Mission Barn report! We have purchased our new building and grounds, changed our name, and made our new home ours. This is all with the service and prayers of so many volunteers and groups like you. Thank you so much.

In the mix of us moving in and getting settled into our new place, we were able to assist our neighbors in East Palestine, Ohio with 300 cleaning buckets in the aftermath of the train derailment in their community. Please continue to keep them in your prayers. We have also been able to share hygiene kits and menstrual kits with many agencies around our conference—Ohio, New York, and West Virginia.

Our cleaning bucket supply is currently low. We are in need of filled cleaning buckets. We are also accepting hygiene and menstrual kits. Please visit umcor.org to get the recipe of what goes in the kits. Our ramp season (which started with our own ramp in March) has been remarkably busy this year with some short ramps, some medium-sized ramps, and some larger ramps, as well as a few boardwalks to help our neighbors in need to get safely in and out of their homes. By the end of our ramp season this year we will have completed 40 ramps and reclaimed 11 ramps. This is a new high for us!

God has and continues to truly bless with donations of money, supplies, and kits, as well as prayers. Whenever we run into a challenge, someone comes alongside us with the a solution to help us figure it out. This has truly happened in many different ways through the process of us getting our building and also us making the building our own. Whether it is needing trailers moved around, gutters/drained cleared, skilled craftsman to do repairs, or someone to open and close our high windows for the seasons, God puts the right person in our path when we need it.

We are excited to share that we are now able to host volunteer teams of 2-20 people at any given time. Elementary students through adults are welcome to come—we have tasks for all ages and abilities! 


Traveling with The Missions Team

On a beautiful fall day in late October, the Missions Team toured the Ruth M. Smith Center in Sheffield and stopped for lunch and a brief visit at the Olmsted Retreat Center in Ludlow. Both organizations are supported by the Missions Committee through financial contributions and donations of supplies.

On the day of the visit, festive Halloween decorations decked the dining and common rooms of the Smith Center. The team met with residents, toured the mansion and the two adjacent residences on the property, and visited the YMCA next door that provides exercise and creative arts and crafts programs for the residents.

The Victorian mansion was donated by the Smith family to the Methodist Women's Home Missionary Society in 1922 in memory of their daughter Ruth. At first it served as

an orphanage. Today it provides a safe, warm home and personal care for adults with disabilities. The private rooms are airy and comfortable, reflecting the personal tastes and interests of their occupants. At noon, lunch at Olmsted Manor overlooking the hills and autumn foliage of Northwest Pennsylvania capped the tour. Team members had an opportunity to walk the grounds and get up-to-date information on future events and retreats to be shared with this congregation. To be used as a retreat, this estate was given to the Western Pennsylvania Conference of the United Methodist Church by the Olmsted family in 1969. Its mission is to provide a sacred space for renewal in an atmosphere of Christian hospitality.



- ** The chimneys urgently require maintenance and structural repair costing approximately \$75,000. As can be seen from ground level, small tree saplings are growing in the nooks and crannies of the bricks and chimney tops.
- ** A new kitchen is needed for food storage and preparation in a single location. Such a facility would eliminate storing and transporting food from the basement pantry, and it would reduce the heat produced in the current kitchen.

THE CHURCH OFFICE WILL BE CLOSED

For Christmas:

The Church Office will be closed on Christmas Day. The Church Office will be closed on Tuesday, December 26, 2023 and will reopen on Wednesday, December 27, 2023.

For the New Year:

The Church Office will be closed on New Year's Day and will reopen on Tuesday, January 2, 2024. Please note that Sunday, December 31, 2023 will be the last day to deliver a 2023 donation to the church. If you plan to bring an end-of-year offering to the church on Sunday, the last day of the year, it must be done at the 9:30am service.

A NOTE ABOUT YEAR-END GIFTS TO THE CHURCH

The Internal Revenue Service says that charitable deductions must be claimed in the year in which they are delivered. The only exception to this ruling is a check that is dated and mailed AND postmarked prior to the end of the year. In this case the postmark constitutes the delivery date.

- Two examples might help:

 1. A check is dated Dece
- 1. A check is dated December 31, 2023 and delivered in person to the church on Tuesday January 2, 2024 or later. The IRS will allow the deduction in 2024, not in 2023, since the check was delivered to the church in 2024.
- 2. A check is written, mailed, AND postmarked in December 2023. The church receives the check on Tuesday January 2, 2024 or later. This check is deductible in 2023, since the postmark represents the delivery date.

Putting an envelope with an end-of-year offering into a mailbox on December 31 will not guarantee a postmark of 2023.
