## Pastor Jodie's Jottings . . .

It is surely spring outside. Since this is our first spring at the parsonage, one of the joys for me this year has been watching to see what flowers bloom around the house. We have had bountiful daffodils, forsythia, hyacinths, purple tulips and now the white iris are in full display. It's a blessing to enjoy these beautiful flowers as they sprout, bloom and surprise us because we didn't know they were there! I'm grateful for all those parsonage families who planted the flowers for the ongoing pleasure of all who live there! I love flowers and fresh vegetables, but I am not a gardener. I must say that it's a blessing to reap what someone else has sown!

So why am I writing about flowers and vegetables? Because it is a sign of a new life cycle, a chance to see things come to life. It is a chance to be reminded of the new life we have in Christ. Just as the snow often reminds me that we are "washed as white as snow" (Ps. 51:7), we have an opportunity to see in spring the truth of the resurrection.

And while some of the ministries of the church wind down in the summer, the church is worshipping, the church continues to have financial needs. The church never goes on vacation!

Don't allow your faith to become dormant in the summer months. Here are some ideas on how to keep your faith alive and blooming in the coming months:

- Attend worship!
- Read the Bible; choose a book that you're not familiar with and read through it.
- Read a book (a good beach read!) on Christianity or spirituality. Our library is full of them and I
  would always recommend Adam Hamilton or Max Lucado.
- Continue to be faithful in your prayers!
- Find a way to serve Jesus during the summer.
- ◆ Join us for a six-week Bible Study beginning in July on the book, Wrestling With Doubt, Finding Faith. We all have our doubts. Join us as we talk through them and strengthen our faith because of them. More information will be coming about this class.



#### MISSIONS COMMITTEE HEARS UPDATE ON THE WAR IN UKRAINE

Pastor Alex McConnell of the Sigel United Methodist Church shared his mission trip to Ukraine with the Missions Team on May 14. He brought into stark relief the devastation of civilian targets. He described the resiliency and courage of the Ukrainian people determined to maintain a semblance of normalcy amid chaos and destruction.

Last year his congregation partnered with a church in Slovakia to carry out a mission that helped widows, orphans and families of Ukrainian soldiers killed in action. They provided financial aid and comfort supplies such as bedding and quilts. As the fighting continues, Pastor Alex and his congregation maintain contact with several people he met in communities near Kiev. His presentation demonstrated how small churches working together can make a positive difference in people's lives.

Over the summer, we will sponsor a special offering to benefit the church in Slovakia that provides aid to Ukrainian families in need. There is no practical way to send supplies such as those Pastor Alex delivered in person. Shipping costs are prohibitive and delivery unreliable, but monetary donations are very much needed to reach inside Ukraine.

## **Love Cupboard Food Pantry**

Our guests coming to our food pantry remain very strong. In May we served 91 households, which represented 197 individuals living in these dwellings and benefiting from our efforts to share nutrition, paper goods, and hygiene items. That equates to around 1 ¼ to 1 ½ ton of goods. We experienced having 10 new households visiting, bringing our total since July of 2023 to 218 households. We have reached 518 different individuals with our efforts in this time frame. Eighty percent of this month's visitors were households of 1 to 3 persons. The other twenty percent are households of 4 to 6 persons. Each of these statistics is important to stay on top of, so we can purchase proper amounts of products. We continue to have great success by giving the visitor "shop by choice" freedom to select individual items out of 14 different categories that are on display. In the past, we have seen a slight decline in warmer months. That trend is not apparent at this time. Your continued support with funds, time, and energy is deeply appreciated. This month a special Care Package of goodies was passed out to individuals with children in their lives. Thanks go out to the Kids2Kids program for this special effort. In July, we are planning on having a representative from our YMCA have a blood pressure station set up for those who would like a quick monitoring.

#### **HELPING TO END HOMELESSNESS**

On May 14, the Missions Committee voted to sponsor a room at The Refuge, an emergency shelter in Erie for homeless families with children that is run by the Erie United Methodist Alliance (EUMA). By sponsoring a room for one year, our church provides for the families who stay in that room and helps them transition into permanent housing.

The room will bear our church's name, and as a congregation we can supply it, paint it, decorate it, and renovate it. Any one of us who travels to Erie can visit and share meals with our sponsored families. We can provide toys for the children and diapers for babies. We can support the families as they prepare to move on. The Refuge keeps families together through difficult times in their lives. It is the only shelter in the city that allows fathers to stay with their children. The average stay is 30-45 days.

In the coming months, we will trim the Caring Tree with ornaments that indicate needed items and suggest gift ideas such as bedding, toys, and more. If you would like to participate in a group that will visit The Refuge, let Pastor Jodie know.

## Work Camp 2024

The summer months are upon us and what better way for the youth to start it than to do our yearly mission work camp. We have put the word out to identify possible projects and have received some good feedback from different sources. We have had to stop adding projects to our lists at this time. Here is a summary of what we have lined up:

- **1.** We will construct and install four combination landings and stairways at the four apartments adjacent to our parking lot. Each project will have handrails installed to code, giving each unit an emergency exit which has been missing.
- 2. We have identified two people needing some adaptations and cleanup made to some ramps and porches.
- **3.** We will be remodeling a wraparound porch for a long-term member of our church. This project will include demolition of handrails, all decking material, and stairway material. Skirting will be removed, power washed, and reinstalled at the end of the project. New synthetic decking will be installed, existing porch posts will be covered with vinyl wrappings, short handrail posts will be covered with vinyl covers, and new vinyl handrails will be installed.

Our youth will have the opportunity to stay at the church for four nights and have the reward of helping others in a mission experience. Meals will be prepared at the church, which will require a group of volunteers helping meal coordinator, Barb Krupnik. Food preparation is definitely an area you can help with, one time or multiple times.

Additionally, we need gofers and carpentry assistants at each of the project sites. You are welcome to join us for a morning, an entire day, or during the Monday through Thursday mission experience. You will get tired, probably ache a little, but you will have a great sense of accomplishment and reward. Share your talents and skills or join in and learn some new ways of enjoying a summer day with our youth. You can also bring along your chair and watch us make some changes in our community through mission work.

#### Finance at a Glance

The **Capital Fund** is the next finance layer to be covered. Last month we addressed General Fund, which is our primary fund account that covers the ministry, church building, and parsonage cost of FUMC. The Capital Fund is the account that covers major expenditures and major projects. The following are examples:

- 1. Purchase of office copier
- 2. Purchase of floor scrubber
- 3. Replacement of furnace or boiler
- 4. Repointing of exterior stone
- 5. Roof replacement
- 6. Window replacement

The major expenditures and major projects are under the umbrella control of our Trustees.

They meet monthly and review the upkeep, control, and maintenance of the assets of the church, parsonage, property, and any building on our church campus.
