Dear Ones,

This time it's different. This is not a transfer. Time is moving so quickly toward my retirement date. I remember my first job after college. My first week I received a benefit manual that declared my retirement date. I was twenty-one years old. Such an impossible date-so many years, so far away! Now it's here. People ask me if I'm excited. Sure! Looking forward to it. But there is so much to do in finishing my time with you and a ton of retirement readiness paperwork to complete by various deadlines. What's it like? It's like senior year finals week and semester paper submission deadlines. Interesting that my time with you as pastor in a university town has been four years. Graduating! Into retirement. Lynne and I have been online looking for a home to buy since October. We made a few trips to actually look at homes with the intention of perhaps buying. Knowing that our end date was coming and we needed to vacate the parsonage, we scheduled the moving company. They asked, "Where to?" I had to say, "Don't know." But now we do. Last week our offer to buy a home near Washington, Pennsylvania was accepted. It's not far from the juncture of routes 79 and 70. If you're coming near and have time, give a call—would be great to see you. My last Sunday in the pulpit is June 4, but our move date is not until June 28. We're using June to pack, to finish paper work, and to enjoy the balance of our Clarion experience. We are nearing the time when I hand the pastor's baton to my successor, the Rev. Jodie Smith. Her first Sunday in the pulpit is July 2. It's nice that some of us have met Pastor Jodie during her tenure as our District Superintendent. It's been my observation that Pastor Jodie has a pastor's heart. She keeps her Bible close, prays, and shares meaningful devotions. I believe you'll find her a companion in Christ, ready to walk life with you, compassionate and loving. You already know that each of your pastors have been different in personality and in specialized knowledge. God has used each one to do aspects of God's will while here. I thank each of you for being part of our Clarion experience. In every church I've pastored there is much I have learned. Every church is different with different needs and different opportunities. I like to think there are also some things and some spiritual insights that I leave with you that you may continue to grow in Christ. Every one of you has had an important role in our time with you. Some of you have been Clarion guides, helping us learn the community. Some of you have been faith mentors and teachers to me and Lynne, as you have been to one another. Some of you have been encouragers. Some of you have wrapped us in your prayers. You have known and will remember me as your pastor. Lynne and I leave offering you friendship. Lynne and I will pray for you and Pastor Jodie. Each of you care and give your love to Pastor Jodie and her husband as you have to me and Lynne. Continue to love one another, and be even more intentional about it. Form membership care teams and make sure that EVERY person of the church is touched by your care as many times yearly as possible. Let no one just drift away. Be intentional about including them and making space for them and meeting their spiritual needs. It can't be just the pastor.

It is the task of the body of Christ. As you do so, be alive to the community about you. Care for your community. And invite to your small groups and to worship all those who show interest. Let them sing with us, play bells with us, serve in mission beside us. Always be prepared to tell one another, family, friends, and others all the wonderful things God in Christ and Spirit has done in your life. Praise the Lord! With love and affection,

It's amazing how a simple "hello" can brighten someone's day, but what if we take conversations one step further? What if we truly listened to people and heard their hearts? How could the Lord use this time to open opportunities to share His love? The following is a personal story of an encounter that changed the hearts of two grandmas.

While traveling in our RV from Pennsylvania to Florida we often stop overnight at Cracker Barrel and enjoy dinner and breakfast the next morning after we rest. The hostess, Lori, met us as we were seated for a late dinner. We said hello but she seemed kind of tired. In fact, my husband John whispered that she probably was not the best face for Cracker Barrel to have as their hospitality person. We had a good dinner and then retired to our RV to sleep in the parking lot. In the morning we went back in for breakfast and who was there to greet us but our faithful hostess, Lori, from the night before. I said, "Did you even get to go home?" She said, "Yes, but didn't get to sleep much." Again, she looked tired and worn out, so I knew she must not have had much sleep. As she walked us to our table, we talked about her having a few days off this coming week, with her sister coming in for a visit. We could see her countenance brighten as she shared about time with family. She then mentioned that she had been battling cancer and just got back to work around Thanksgiving. She also shared that she has not been able to see her first grandson yet, who was five months old. With tears welling up in her eyes, she told us that her daughter bought her a ticket for Christmas and she would be flying to go see him.

As she left our table, tears also welled up in my eyes realizing how blessed I am with how often I see my granddaughters. Lori soon returned with pictures of him on her phone. Her smile grew and her countenance brightened even more when she shared the pictures. I then showed her a picture of my four granddaughters. As we were leaving, I was led to slip a "love gift" into her apron and we hugged. As I left, I knew that grandma hearts were joined at Cracker Barrel restaurant. The Lord gives us opportunities daily, such as this, to connect with others. Here are some ways we can move beyond "hello" to establish the right to share our own personal stories of faith:



Youth Work Camp 2023

Each year the youth of our church identifies a project that we can tackle that demonstrates the mission emphasis that our church strongly believes in and supports. This year our special project is building a new garage for our pastor and family at our Wood Street parsonage location.

Many of you know that this project has been endorsed by our Trustees, Finance, and Church Council as one of our three major summer projects. The following steps are in progress to make this project happen. A special fundraising campaign is in place, the demolition of the old garage is scheduled with a contractor, and the foundation-blockwork-cement slab will follow by the same contractor. This slab will be completed in early June and the site will be ready for the youth's carpentry phase on June 26. All building materials are ordered and will arrive in the last two weeks of June.

Here is where your prayers and support come into play. The trustees will arrive first—no extra help needed. The bulk of the building supplies will arrive on June 23—rain or shine. We definitely will need help here. Six persons for approximately 1½ hours. The reconstruction of the new garage will start Monday morning on June 26 and conclude on Thursday afternoon, June 29. Yes, this is an aggressive schedule, but we have accomplished similar tasks in the past in this timeframe.

Here is where you can personally help. We need:

- 1. Assistance daily to prepare breakfast, lunch and supper (including cleanup).
- 2. Someone to deliver snacks to the worksite each day at 10:00am.
- 3. Helpers on site to keep all workers hydrated.
- **4.** Go-fers . . . go for this and that---help keep worksite organized. Not heavy work but important.
- 5. Spectators---this is a perfect opportunity to bring your lawn chair and watch the workers and their daily progress.
- **6.** We will share devotions each night around 5:45—join in and be part of our faith walk and growing experience.
- 7. Wednesday 5:45pm—work camp communion—special event in sanctuary—please be part of this time with us.

Show your interest and we will coordinate the schedule with you. As we get closer to the date, we will work with Darren for you to sign up through the church email system, which we have just updated with "an event option."

The Youth Group is once again selling **C&A Trees Gift Certificates**. If you purchase flowers, trees, shrubs, or plants OR spend money in their gift shop, please purchase a certificate from the Youth Group. C&A Trees generously donates 20% of all proceeds to support our activities. The gift certificates must be used by June 30, 2023. The certificates are available Monday through Friday in the church office during regular hours. We will also do our best to be available from 9:15am to 11:00am in the Gathering Area or Wesley Chapel. If for some reason you cannot make it into the church, please email youthdirector@fumc-clarion.org and we will personally get the gift certificates to you in person or by mail. Thank you for not only supporting our ministry, but also supporting C&A Trees, a big supporter of our youth in Clarion.

The Youth Group continues to support our local **Wreaths Across America** in December 2023. It is not too early to sponsor a wreath, especially with Memorial Day right around the corner. 

This mail comes to you differently this time. Instead of a special mailing just to kids, this page is now in the All Church Newsletter for all the people of the church to read and enjoy with you. Near the time you get this mail we will be celebrating a special Sunday we celebrate once a year called Pentecost Sunday. Many of our English words have their roots in other languages of the world, like "Pentecost." Pentecost comes from an old word from Greece and means "fifty." For Christians, pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples of Jesus fifty days after Easter.

The Holy Spirit was a special gift Jesus promised would come to his disciples. They did not know just when the Holy Spirit would come. He said they should wait for it, which was probably so they would not miss the time of its coming. When the Holy Spirit came, it was amazing! There was a clear sense of power in the Holy Spirit. When the Spirit came it seemed to dance around them like fire, maybe like the lights of a flickering campfire. It was a happy, wondrous, amazing, can't miss it and don't want to miss it time. It is not a one time gift; it is a gift that stays with us.

Soon, in the early evenings, we will see flickering lights in the grasses and meadows around us. These lights happen near the same time every year in the Clarion area, not long after Pentecost. These flickering lights are also beautiful, wondrous, happy moments that bring amazement to children and adults alike. Although we know these lights as "lightning bugs," they can be a reminder to us of the special gift Jesus gave to his disciples. This same gift Jesus still gives to those who believe and open their hearts to Jesus. We open our hearts each time we pray, and when we are ready and the time is right, Jesus sends us the gift of the Holy Spirit.

When we see lightning bugs we can remember to give thanks to God for the beauties of creation. We can remember to open our hearts to God and Jesus in prayer. And we can remember that Jesus promises us the wonderful gift of the Holy Spirit. Wait for the moment with excited anticipation. The Holy Spirit will become a best friend for you. Thank you, Jesus.

#### **Providing Access to Dental Care in Central America**

Belinda Forbes came to our church in April to share her work in Nicaragua as a volunteer with AMOS Health and Hope, a clinic and training center in the capital, Managua. As a dentist serving more than 30 years in this country, she is fluent in Spanish and knows the extreme challenges many people face in access to healthcare. She teaches patients at the clinic about their dental health and trains rural health promoters to provide basic dental care and teach dental hygiene practices in the 23 isolated and remote rural communities they serve. Dental disease is a universal problem these dedicated workers see everyday, especially in children, and they want to learn more to help their communities.

On April 17, our Missions Team hosted a dinner for Dr. Forbes, followed by her multimedia presentation in the Sanctuary and a reception in the Gathering Area. Her mission to bring healthcare and hope inspired by Jesus' example to love one another was conveyed in her description of the workers and patients she serves.
