



- **Love Cupboard**—Help with setting up, unloading, packing, assisting clients, and/or registration (Meets the third Wednesday of every month)



# Kids 2 Kids

**Kids2Kids** is our mission group for children in grades K-5<sup>th</sup> grade. Students in grades 6-12 are also welcome and encouraged to assist with these efforts. We meet the second Sunday of each month.

The children learn about global and local missions and how they can shine Jesus' light on those around them. Our focus for the 2023-2024 academic year is The Fruit of the Spirit.

In the month of September, as one of our activities, Kids2Kids will be preparing Love Cupboard Back-to-School care packages. Specifically, these will be distributed to those families with children through age 12 and ages 13-18. We encourage and would be grateful for your donations for this effort.

At the last tally, we are supporting families that total 60+ younger children and 20+ teens.

# "Three Summer Projects" Update

In late spring – early summer, we asked you to support the "Three Summer Projects" that were planned and coordinated by our Trustees. Sufficient funds were received and designated for these lofty endeavors. Let us give you an overview of the progress and success of each.

- 1. **Memory Garden**—We contracted out the removal of the old railroad tie wall and large border shrubbery adjacent to the alley behind the church. It was successfully replaced with a Versa Lock masonry wall. Proper drainage was installed to prevent the wall from pushing out and deteriorating. At the conclusion of contractor work, the garden volunteers started their planning and implementing upgrades. This work included proper amounts of topsoil and mulch being brought in as well as weeding and removal of unacceptable foliage. Once completed, new shrubs were planted. There was also a realignment of perennial plants and attractive flora was added. The goal became planting foliage that had heights that were acceptable to the layout and terrain of the garden. After many hours of labor, the first-year garden is pleasingly acceptable to the eye and controllable to the volunteers as we move forward to its enjoyment. Our first reception was held in it on July 12. Go out to see the ambience and comfort of our Memory Garden.
- 2. **Parsonage Patio**—The existing patio was deteriorated and causing water penetration to the foundation of the parsonage. Downspout rain water drainage was rerouted and proper slope of cement patio was corrected when it was poured. Topsoil was sloped and grass was planted to enhance the usage and attractiveness of the patio. In the process of this upgrade it was identified that the back porch also needed to be upgraded with low maintenance materials. Planning and the work were started and completed on this "add on" part with the labor of church staff and volunteers. It included rebuilding the steps, laying new carpet, wrapping the posts with aluminum, a new vinyl handrail, and trim work. Our pastor and their family and guests will enjoy this addition for many decades to come.
- 3. Parsonage Garage—Volunteers worked to remove reusable materials before the garage was demolished and hauled to disposal grounds. Excavating was completed for footer installation and cement blocks were laid followed by gravel base, plastic vapor barrier, wire mesh and proper finish cement floor with floor drain and sealed to protect long-term quality of cement finish. Building materials were planned, cost was projected, and the materials were preordered for the startup of our summer Youth Work Camp. Approximately 25 different youth and adult volunteers successfully completed the structure—24 x 32 garage and storage utility room. Its design has a maintenance free approach to each possible part of it. It is also designed to enhance and match the presentation of the parsonage. As of this writing we have one major item we are waiting for a contractor to finish—the cement driveway from the alley to the garage. Once completed, it will have a properly installed fence to allow for privacy and pet safety. Solar lighting with motion detector was installed at the rear of the garage. LED lighting invites you into a wired garage assembly inside. Each garage door is assembled with a car controlled door opener. Additionally, we have installed a six foot utility room door to take larger equipment into the backyard area. As many of you know, this new garage is a replacement to an old carriage garage. Our new facility enhances its usage and value to our parsonage.


We are one in the Spirit, equal before God, lay, clergy, bishop alike. Each called, each gifted, each serves, each answers before God.

### The Missions Team Hosted Two Speakers at Their May 30<sup>th</sup> Meeting

A primary objective moving into the second half of 2023 is to increase our outreach and participation in the community. So, the Missions Team was fortunate to have Brenda Smathers present the broad range of activities and programs offered to seniors by the Clarion Area Agency on Aging, an organization that we support with donations.

Since 1979 the agency has assisted seniors in ways that enable them to stay in their own homes. These include personal care supervision, adult day care, caregiver support, help in purchasing medical equipment, and home safety modifications to name but a few of the services described in Brenda's presentation. The second presenter of the evening was Blair Moses Kamanga, a United Methodist missionary serving as the agriculture coordinator in Mozambique, a coastal country In Southeast Africa. The Missions Team met with Mr. Kamanga for a live conversation in real time despite a difference of seven time zones and over 8,000 miles. He spoke of training local farmers in planning and methods to improve their farms and produce. He described his work with war refugees to teach them farming techniques that put food on their tables and improved their ability in agricultural production. His commitment to helping refugees began in his native Malawi, a country bordering Mozambique. Mr. Kamanga told of how refugees begged for leftover garden vegetables, and how, as a result, he requested a small piece of land to produce and share vegetables. His current refugee program grew from that beginning.

Donations are needed to support Mr. Kamanga's work, which earlier this year was impacted by the devastation of Cyclone Freddy, the longest-lasting and most powerful tropical cyclone ever recorded worldwide. If you would like to donate to Mr. Kamanga's ministry, there are a couple ways to do so. The key is to provide Blair Moses Kamanga's name and his Global Ministries Advance # 3022588.

### A NOTE FROM YOUR FINANCE COMMITTEE

Although this is the 4<sup>th</sup> straight month that income for current expenses has fallen short of budgeted expectations, we managed to remain on our budget projections for the year. Our expenses have been below budgeted projections, which is good. Bills come in throughout the year, however, some of which are considerable (e.g., taxes, insurance, maintenance contracts). You are to be commended in fully subscribing to the summer capital projects—the Memory Garden wall, the parsonage patio replacement, and the parsonage garage replacement. Through your stewardship of giving both monetary gifts and labor, we have completed these much needed repairs without the need to borrow. As we turn our attention to operational expenses, we can anticipate some of these yearly bills to come due. At that point, expenses will outpace income. Let's not let that happen. Please give prayerful attention to your weekly tithes and offerings. Your faithfulness has made our church strong. Christ's message will continue to be proclaimed and spread, for you are his witnesses.

Whether you are an individual or a group of people who have become displaced or churchless because of closing or disaffiliation, Lighthouse Congregations will be there for you during this difficult time. As you consider what is next, specific pathways from which you may choose will continue to emerge as the Conference, Districts, and local churches come together to be the connection at its best.


